

Completion Report: Women Awareness Session on Gender Equality and Rights

Organized by: Student Union for Rohingya Development (SURD)

Date: 20th November 2024

Home-Based Awareness, Block A, Kutupalong Registered Camp



Overview

The Women Awareness Session on Gender Equality and Rights was a significant step towards empowering Rohingya women with the knowledge and skills to advocate for their rights. Targeting 13 adult women, the session aimed to address deep-rooted gender inequalities, encourage education, and foster economic independence. By creating a safe and engaging learning environment, SURD sought to inspire women to take proactive steps in shaping their future and contributing to community development.

Key Activities

The session was designed with a blend of interactive discussions, practical exercises, and resource sharing

- 1. Interactive Discussions EQUITY, AND EXCELLENCE.
 - 1. **Understanding Gender Equality**: Explored the basic principles of gender equality and its relevance in the Rohingya context. The session emphasized that equality benefits not just women but entire communities.
 - 2. **Rights Awareness**: Covered women's legal rights concerning education, healthcare, and protection against gender-based violence, contextualizing these within the community's norms.
 - 3. **Breaking Myths and Stereotypes**: Addressed common misconceptions about gender roles through open dialogue, fostering a supportive and reflective space.

2. Scenario-Based Learning

1. Participants engaged in role-playing activities to practice asserting their rights in hypothetical scenarios, such as negotiating educational opportunities for their daughters or seeking vocational training.



3. Confidence-Building Exercises

1. Group activities focused on improving public speaking, sharing personal stories, and fostering mutual encouragement among participants.

4. **Resource Sharing**

1. Provided information about local support systems, including educational opportunities, vocational training programs, and platforms for women to voice their concerns.

5. Community Pledge

1. Participants collectively pledged to advocate for gender equality within their families and communities, symbolizing their commitment to change.





Outcomes and Impact

The session achieved several transformative outcomes

1. Empowered Participants

✓ Participants reported a greater understanding of their rights and the significance of gender equality. Many expressed a newfound confidence to assert their opinions within family and community settings.

2. Motivated Actions

✓ Some women shared their aspirations to pursue education or start small businesses, inspired by the session's emphasis on economic independence.

3. Ripple Effect in the Community

✓ Attendees committed to spreading awareness among other women, amplifying the session's impact and creating a foundation for broader societal change.

4. Breaking Barriers

✓ The session fostered a supportive network where women felt comfortable discussing their challenges, reducing feelings of isolation and helplessness.



Challenges Encountered

Despite the session's success, some challenges highlighted areas for improvement

- 1. Cultural Resistance
 - Prevalent traditional norms and skepticism among family members initially discouraged some participants from attending. These were addressed through pre-session engagement and outreach by trusted community members.
- 2. Limited Resources
 - The home-based setup restricted the session's scale. Expanding to reach more women will require additional funding and logistical support.

3. Sustained Engagement

> Encouraging consistent participation remains a challenge, given the competing responsibilities and mobility constraints of women in the camps.

Funding and Support

Future Plans

SURD is committed to furthering its mission of gender equality and empowerment through

1. **Expanding Outreach**: Scaling up awareness sessions to other blocks within Kutupalong Camp and beyond, targeting a broader demographic, including younger women and adolescent girls.



- 2. **Introducing Vocational Training**: Launching skills development programs tailored for women, focusing on sewing, handicrafts, and other marketable skills to promote economic independence.
- 3. **Engaging Male Advocates**: Conducting gender-sensitization workshops for men to foster understanding and support for women's empowerment. This inclusive approach aims to create allies within the community.

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- 4. **Establishing Peer Support Networks**: Creating groups where women can share experiences, collaborate on advocacy efforts, and mentor one another in navigating challenges.
- 5. **Partnerships for Sustainability**: Collaborating with local and international organizations to secure resources and expertise for ongoing and future initiatives.
- 6. **Campaigns for Cultural Change**: Designing long-term awareness campaigns that address deeply ingrained norms and promote progressive attitudes towards gender equality.
